From the President and CEO's Desk

The New Normal

Thank you for standing by the animals throughout the public health crisis. You have made an incredible difference in the lives of Ottawa's most vulnerable animals and have been a steadfast supporter throughout these challenging times. I cannot thank you enough for your commitment.

Before the pandemic and ubiquitous Zoom meetings, I would sometimes work late, attending committee or other meetings. As I would leave, visitors and staff would have gone home. The animals would be asleep, or at least quiet. The building was big, empty and lonely, almost like a mausoleum. The shelter was designed to be a meeting place for people as well as a safe haven for animals, and when there are few people, it feels, well, a bit sad. That is how it has sometimes felt through lockdowns and health precautions over the past year and a half.

Because of your ongoing support, on Sept. 8, for the first time since March 2020, the OHS opened the doors of the Shirley Kearns Memorial Adoption Centre to visitors. The day was a long time coming. Several times, we began preparations for reopening, only to delay because of COVID and provincial requirements.

Of course, you ensured core services lost and found, animal care, veterinary care, adoptions, admission of ownersurrendered animals, emergency housing — remained available to Ottawa's animals during the pandemic. We have been very cautious, often going above and beyond provincial and public health guidelines, because an outbreak among staff would be disastrous for Ottawa's animals, left with nowhere to go.



Because of you, new programs that were launched during and because of the pandemic: the Emergency Pet Food Bank and Partner Support Program will continue for the foreseeable future.

Other programs offered on-site will require staff training and re-training and confidence that they can be offered safely, and as a result, will be re-launched over time.

For the safety of our staff and clients, and to comply with restrictions from the province and Ottawa Public Health, the Mobile Spay/Neuter Service will remain suspended for the time-being. The OHS is planning to resume this important service safely as soon as possible.

Thank you again. You've been there for the animals through the challenges of the pandemic, and I am so grateful for your support as we move out of these strange and, frankly, frightening times.

Sundae's Story will Melt Your Heart

Lost, hurt and afraid, Sundae, a two-year-old cat, was found on a hot summer night on a busy street, in heavy traffic.

Sundae was found all alone, lying in the street, in a lot of pain. It's likely that she was hit by a car.

When she arrived at the OHS, Sundae was in poor shape. She had obvious, painful injuries: a broken tail, a broken tooth and her front right leg hung uselessly. But other invisible injuries could not be ruled out. Did Sundae have brain damage or other internal injuries? Would she become stable and strong enough to have surgery?

Thanks to you, Sundae got the care she needed and started becoming stronger and stronger. As the days passed, she perked up, began to eat more, and was more affectionate with the staff.



Because you care, Sundae received surgery to remove her broken tail.

But Sundae still had a long road to recovery as her leg was still a concern. X-rays did not show any broken bones, making it clear that Sundae had suffered from nerve damage.

Thanks to you, Sundae was able to have her limp, painful leg removed so that she could live her best, pain-free life.

Because of you, Sundae got a second chance. Thank you for being there for Sundae and other animals just like her.

Critical Care

You make life-saving care possible for Ottawa's animals. At the OHS, the critical care unit is where many animals hang in the balance between life and death or in recovery from a life-saving surgery.

Without you, the animals could not receive this crucial level of care. You are a hero, and here are just a few of the stories you made possible.



Charlie

Because of you, this sweet, eight-year-old poodle, who was found alone on the streets, got the care he needed. Charlie had dirty, matted fur shaved away, received dental surgery and had a hernia repair — all because you care.

Poor Sparky was found all alone in a corn field with a broken leg that had been injured for a long time. We can't say for certain how long Sparky had been enduring the pain, but when he was brought to the OHS, you made sure he got the care he deserved. Thanks to you, Sparky recovered and went on to find his forever family.



Leah

Leah, a 14-week-old kitten, was rushed to the OHS after a collision with a car had broken her leg and pelvis. Because of you, Leah received surgery to remove her damaged leg and is learning to walk comfortably on three legs. Without you, Leah's story would be very different.

These are only a few of the life-saving stories you have made possible. Thanks to you, Ottawa's animals who have experienced unimaginable ordeals can receive the care and treatment they desperately deserve.

A True Friend to the Animals
