Every rabbit environment needs:



A solid floor

Enclosures with wire or mesh floors can cause serious injuries to a rabbit's feet



A space to hide and perch

Try a hide-and-perch box, or a multi-level enclosure



Comfortable bedding

Rabbit shavings, shredded paper or blankets



A litter box

Did you know rabbits can be fully litter trained? This helps with free-roaming rabbits



Hay, lots of hay

Hay is essential for maintaining a rabbit's teeth




Food and water

A rabbit should have access to fresh water at all times, and fresh food daily



Controlled temperature

Rabbits are very sensitive to heat stroke. Enclosures should be below 80F and well-ventilated



How big should a rabbit enclosure be?

A rabbit's enclosure should be at least four times the size of your rabbit, but the bigger the better!
